

The robots in the story can press their buttons and make things happen, like blowing bubbles, or playing music. If you built a robot, what would it do?


What would it look like? Can you draw it here?

The robots live in a world that is very grey. Can you decorate the spaceship with a pattern and lots of colour? You could try using these shapes in your design.






The collectors are hairy and scary. Can you match these other pairs of rhyming words by drawing lines between them?
